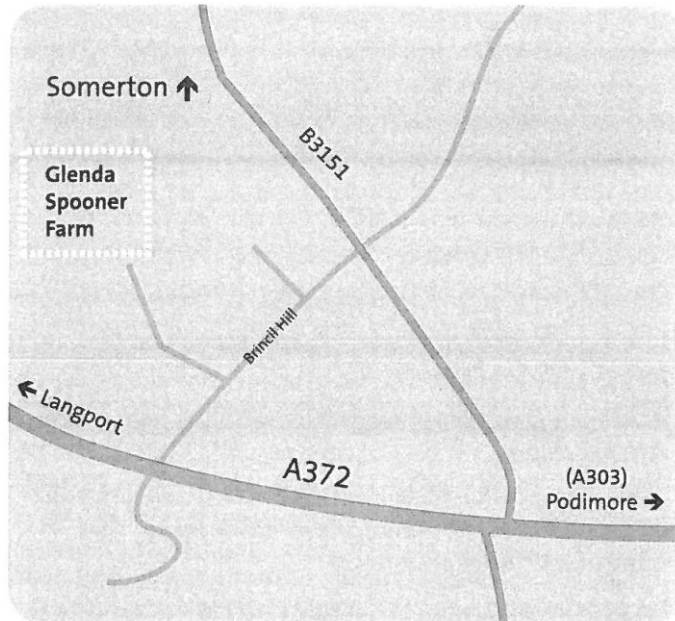

- C) support and encourage the sport of dog showing

any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)

29. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.

30. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Please report anything suspicious or of concern to a committee member or ring steward.

Our Judges Cont

Claire Sharp (Affilato)

I have been showing dogs since 1983 when I began Junior Handling. I was given my first dog—a GWP—when I was 13 years old and made him into a Full Champion with 6 Challenge Certificates and a Field Trial win. I stayed active in GWPs for 27 years breeding many CC and Field Trial / Working Test award winners. I have also co-owned a Full Champion GSP and have bred several Italian Spinone Show Champions including the breed's youngest ever title holder and was top breeder in 2017. I have a keen interest in spaniel breeds having watched them work on several shoots over the years. I have passed the A3 assessment on cockers.

Miss N Walker (Trefaine)

I owned my first Irish Setter in 1978. Started showing in 1981. Have bred and owned a CC winner and bred a Junior Warrant holder. Can trace our kennel back 6 generations. Have judged Irish Setters all over the UK and have recently passed my A3 assessment. I also am looking forward to showing my new puppy this year.

Rules & Regulations Cont

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible
20. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
21. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
22. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
23. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration of addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Regulation shall be sufficient notice thereof.
24. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
25. Please do not obstruct gangways with trolleys. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/cages.
26. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
27. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
28. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at

Rally involves you and your dog working as a team to navigate a course with numbered signs indicating different exercises to perform. The course is set by the judge. There is no pause between exercises - you and your dog work briskly through the course without direction from the judge. You are encouraged to talk to and praise your dog during the performance. Information About Our Judges (in alphabetical order)

Chris Hill (Scalene)

Showed and bred Weimaraners through the 1980s and 90s. Have owned a Hungarian Vizsla, now show and breed Affenpinschers. Have made up Sh Ch & Ch in both Weimaraners and Affenpinschers under the Scalene affix. Award CCs in 3 breeds. Founder member and now Chairman and Show Manager for the East Anglian Gundog Society, Chief Steward for the East of England Championship dog show and Assistant Chief Steward for National Gundog Association.

Emma-Jane Laroche (Emmroche)

I have been an owner & breeder of Lagotto Romagnolo for the past 14 years. I have shown in the UK and abroad, winning a reserve CACIB in Italy 2008.

I have completed the required seminars, including a breed seminar and look forward now the breed has its own classes to progress. I am particularly interested in all water dogs. I have competed to Championship level in dog agility & have been a finalist at Crufts.

Maria Leach (Kissock)

I have owned gundogs all my life and have been involved with Flatcoats for 18 years. I do some showing, working and obedience with my dogs. And have bred 4 litters, producing stud book and CC winning dogs. I've been judging this breed for 6 years, and attended all the relevant courses/seminars, acquiring sufficient experience to judge one of our breed open shows next year.

Mrs P Mott (Meaculpa)

We purchased our first Lab in 1983, a yellow dog whom we called Ben. At six months old I took him back to the breeder to see how we were progressing with him. The breeder was delighted with him and wanted to show him; we said Ok and that was the start of a lovely time going to the shows. The breeder showed Ben and he gained his Junior Warrant at 9 months; he had 00 hips. Later I took up showing and we purchased a yellow bitch who was out of Ben's litter sister. I went to Ring Class to learn how to show and move him. In all the years we have had Labs we only had a litter when we wanted to carry on the line we loved. We went to all the shows we could. I took up stewarding and loved it. I still steward and judge and I have enjoyed it. Ben was out of Ballyduff Marlborough of Junicott and Fabracken Dancing Shadow and both were black; Ben's kennel name was Fabracken Expressly Yours.

Pat Parry (Mitcharron)

I have been in Golden's since 1982 and have bred the occasional litter. I have bred 3 International Champions, 2 of which I still have and 1 that lives in Spain. I have been judging since 1991 and did my breed show in 2014. I love showing the dogs and have shown 4 of my dogs to their stud book number.

Sandra Rowbury (Stormdancer)

Owned Weimaraners for over 40 years, shown in the UK and on the continent for 30 years. Judged for 25 years. Largest importer of Weimaraners and Slovakian Rough Haired Pointers in the world.

Mrs Christine Schofield

I have owned, shown and bred gundogs for over 40 years, starting off with Irish Setters and then going on to also exhibit Irish Red & White Setters, English Setters, Pointers, Italian Spinone, Curly Coated Retrievers, Hungarian Vizslas, Welsh Springer Spaniels, and Hungarian Wirehaired Vizslas.

I have been awarded top awards in ALL the breeds that I have exhibited and have bred/owned show champions in three of the gundog breeds.

I am now approved to award CC's in Irish Setters, Irish Red & White Setters, Hungarian Wirehaired Vizslas, Welsh Springer Spaniels and Italian Spinone.

IMPORTED BREED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

A.V. NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED: For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

GOOD CITIZEN SCHEME: For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above.

SP. WORKING GUNDOG: For dogs which have won Prizes and Awards in recognised competition at Gundog Working Tests or have gained their Show Gundog Qualifier or a Gundog Working Certificate.

SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 09:00hrs
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10:00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees
Members £4.25 First Entry, £1:50 All Subsequent Entries Same dog
Non-Members £5:50 First Entry, £1.75 All Subsequent Entries Same dog
Stakes Classes £3.00
Not for Competition £1.00 per dog.

Adverts in the catalogue £5.00 full page, £3.00 half page
Membership £3:50 Single £4.50 Joint. Due 1st. January Annually.

6. The prize money on offer at this show is: in each Stakes Class :1st £20.00, 2nd £15.00, 3rd £10.00, Reserve £5.00
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show** and subsequent placings must be selected from those dogs declared Best of Breed, Best from Any Variety Not Separately Classified and Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show / event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

**Annex B to F Regulations F(B)
REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION**

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:- (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board. (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed. (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the Individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
